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Disclosures of Pecuniary Interest

Once sworn into office, it is the obligation of all members of the LaSalle Police Services Board (LPSB), when making decisions or giving advice on matters, to act honestly and responsibly in carrying out their functions. Generally, those obligations include the disclosures of pecuniary interest.

A pecuniary interest is a matter where one may have any direct or indirect conflict in relation to a matter under consideration. For an "indirect pecuniary interest", see [Section 2 of the Municipal Conflict of Interest Act](#). For a "deemed direct or indirect pecuniary interest", see [Section 3 of the Municipal Conflict of Interest Act](#).

The onus is on the member of the LPSB to determine whether they are affected by the pecuniary interest provisions.

Effective January 1, 2019, it is required that all members of the LPSB submit their disclosures of pecuniary interest in writing to the Board Secretary at the meeting at which the member disclosed an interest, or immediately following the meeting, using the [Disclosure of Pecuniary Interest Form](#).

A registry has been created of the written disclosures, which is available for public inspection.

The ***Municipal Conflict of Interest Act, 1990***, requires that every local board retain record of conflicts of interest in the LPSB Minutes and in a registry (RSO, 1990, c. M.50, s. 6.1).
